#### For horses:

Each horse should have a FEI passport and veterinary certificate of that country, from which they go to Russia. To get more detailed information, please, consult the local Veterinary Department of your country.

Since 01 January 2007 new Veterinary certificates approved form "Horses for participation in international events for the term of 90 days at most", came into effect from 11.08.2006 and now are valid for EC countries.

The Veterinary Certificate to enter Russian Federation for competing from European countries (Schengen, etc) should be ORIGINAL, with sign and stamp of State veterinary of the exporter's territory. The Original Certificate blank (different for all the European countries), with hologram and colored should be requested at State Veterinary Department of any European country as soon as possible.

Attention: in veterinary certificate <u>"STUD FARM "GEORGENBURG"</u> must be indicated as a receiving part for temporary entrance of sport horses to Russian Federation. In case of wrong documents or absence of the necessary documents for the entrance to Russia, you have no right to cross the Russian border and will be sent back! Without exceptions! Please arrange all the necessary documents carefully!



If you have any questions concerning the arrangement of customs and frontier documents for people and horses – please do not hesitate to contact the Organising Committee in advance. We will help you most willingly.

### THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

### **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
