The Veterinary Certificate to enter Russian Federation for competing from European countries (Schengen) should be **ORIGINAL**, with sign and stamp of State veterinary of the territory exporter. The Original Certificate blank (different for all the European countries), with hologram and coloured should be requested at Government Veterinary Department of any European country as soon as possible.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

Appendix 1

VETERINARY REQUIREMENTS CONCERNING THE IMPORT OF SPORT HORSES PARTICIPATING IN INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS TO RUSSIAN FEDERATION

Only healthy horses, which have not been vaccinated against infectious encephalomyelitis of all kinds and African plague are allowed to imported to Russian Federation. The horses should come from farms and administrative units, which are free from infections animal diseases including the following:

- Infectious encephalomyelitis of all kinds, viral arteriitis; African plague of pigs and horses, - during the last 3 years on the territory of the country
- Glanders - during the last 2 years on the territory of the country
- Foot and mouth disease, stomatitis vesicularis, equine influenza – during the last 12 months on the territory of the country
- Tripanosomus su auru (tripanosomo Evansi), piroplasmosis (babesia Cabani), nuttalliosis (babesia Equivi) and hydrophobia – during the last 12 months on the territory of the administrative unit (state; province, land, district, etc)
- Infectious metritis of horses – during the last 12 months on the territory of a stud-farm
- Rhynopneumonia, infectious anaemia; horse scab and horse pox – during the last 3 month on the territory of a stud-farm

Before being sent off, the horses should be kept under the supervision of the state-veterinary service of the exporting country not less than 21 days. In this period diagnostically investigations are conducted in the state veterinary laboratory using the methods accepted in the exporting country. The horses are investigated for the presence glanders, tripanosomus, su-auu (tripanosoma Evansi), piroplasmosis (babesia Cabani), nuttalliosis (babesia Equivi), anaplasmosis, rhynopneumonia, infectious metritis, infectious anaemia, viral arteteriitis, stomatitis vesicularis.

The horses coming for competitions, should be vaccinated against influenza with the inactivated vaccine not later than in 30-45 days before sending off.

Horse trucks are prepared according to the rules accepted in the exporting country.

Executions of the conditions, described in the present requirements, should be completely confirmed with the animal health certificate, signed by state-veterinary surgeon and be written in Russian and in the language of the exporting country, with indication of the date of diagnostic investigations and vaccinations.

Transporting of the animals to Russian Federation is possible only when the permission of ministry of Agriculture of Russian Federation is given.

Countries belonging to the Commonwealth of Independent States, import horses according to the intergovernmental agreement on veterinary concerning the animal health certificate.

When the horses have been delivered to Russian Federation, they are placed and kept under the control of state veterinary service. The horses imported from different countries, are kept in the isolation from each other during the whole period, except for the direct participation in sport competitions. When the competitions are over, horses should be sent off from the territory of Russian Federation without any additional investigations and treatment.
