VI. REGISTRATION OF RIDERS & HORSES

All Riders & horses participating in any International Eventing competition must be registered with the FEI. (Art. 511.1 and 511.2)

1. QUALIFICATIONS

Each NF must certify the qualification of each horse and rider and list the competitions which enabled horse and rider to qualify, according to the qualification procedure established for each star level (*according Art.506. Rules for Eventing*).

Qualifications may be achieved as a combination or separately by rider and horse in the current or preceding 2 years.

Required minimum Qualifying Results (QRs) - according Art.506.5. Rules for Eventing.

VII. VETERINARY ASPECTS (Art. 1004.2, 1005, 1011, 1021.1 & 518)

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & "Rules for Eventing" **Art. 518.1 for CCIs and 518.2 for CICs.**

Art. 511.2.2

Every horse entered for any competition at CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCIs 2/1* in a foreign country (GRs Art. 141.2), and all horses entered for CICs 3*, CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 511.2.3

Horses taking part in CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCIs 2/1* in the country in which they are resident are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned Paragraph 2.2. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given **between 1 and 3 months apart**. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding **6** months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING PROCEDURE FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs, Ch. V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, World Cup™ Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CCIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

VIII. CUSTOM FORMALITIES & HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

1. CUSTOM FORMALITIES

All participants should inform OC at least 2 weeks before event:

- border crossing points,
- date of crossing Russian border,
- horse data,
- transport data

Details on required customs documents, border crossing points, times of opening and customs agencies will be sent after receiving "Entries" to all NFs, who declared their participation.

The Organizing Committee will not pay the cost of travelling for competitors, horses and grooms also not in Russia. Custom duties etc. are for the account of the competitors.

NFs holding an international event in their country should inform their National Veterinary Authority and their Customs Authority at least four weeks beforehand. They should request every facility to assist the movement of horses accompanied by FEI Passports, and the necessary veterinary certification at frontier crossing points into and out of their countries. (Vet. Regs. Art. 1004.2)

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Details on compulsory health tests, specimen import licences (for Laboratory Health Tests), which will be applied to horses attending this event will be sent after receiving "Entries" to all NFs, who declared their participation.

3. APPROVED LABORATORY

IX. MISCELLANEOUS

1. OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS (Art. 167 & 171)

All complaints to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150 or equivalent.

2. EVENTING MEDICAL CARD (Annex 7 "Rules for Eventing")

OCs must draw the attention of all competitors that they must carry readily accessible on themselves a medical card for the Cross-Country Test. Armbands must be checked by the OC upon arrival to the competition by the riders and checked by the Official Doctor and the Technical Delegate for accurate information.

3. INSURANCES

"All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy up to date".

The Organising Committee is not responsible for riders, grooms and horses in case of accidents or illness as well as in case of theft, damages, fire etc.

4. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 & 115)

The OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. All modifications made to the schedule must have the approval of the FEI Secretary General.

5. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

OC to include details concerning right of entry to show-grounds of owners, grooms, riders, other persons.

6. STABLE SECURITY AND STEWARDING AT INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

Minimum requirements to ensure implementation of Veterinary Regulations, Art.1005.2

a. ACCESS TO STABLE AREA

The stables will be completely enclosed within a suitably restrictive perimeter (stable area) which will act both as a deterrent to the admission of unauthorised persons and to the exit of horses. The area must be sufficiently large to allow horses to be evacuated from the stables in an emergency but still remain within the confines of the perimeter.

The stable area will include only stables. Lorries, caravans, etc. will be placed near the competition area.

Access to stables will be limited to those persons indicated in VRs Art. 1005.2.5.

b. CONTROL OF ACCESS

A control system will operate at all entrance gates so that there will be an efficient control for entering the stables during the Event.

c. STEWARDING OF STABLE AREA

At least one stable steward, directly responsible to the Chief Steward, must be present or readily available in the vicinity of the stable area 24 hours a day during the entire duration of the event. He may be assisted by deputies as required. The steward/deputies must regularly patrol the stable area,

without establishing any predetermined pattern, to discourage any form of illegal practices or abuses to horses. Any misdemeanours must be reported immediately to the stable steward who must, in turn, report to the Chief Steward.

The duty of the stewards is therefore to safeguard the welfare of the horses and to prevent any form of illegal practices.

7. RESULTS

In order to proceed with the results publication for qualification purposes, the FEI requires results to be sent in immediately after the conclusion of the event. Please refer to compulsory format for CCIs and CICs. Results to be sent by e-mail to **f.diserens@horsesport.org**, preferably on Excel file immediately after the event. All results must include FEI Passport Registration number of horses. **All riders who have not completed the event must appear on the results sheets.** Exact distance of the Cross-country course must be included on result sheet.

WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The following Code of Conduct was elaborated by the FEI for all people involved in the welfare of competing horses. The purpose is to ensure the health and welfare of horses participating under FEI Rules and Regulations and protecting the good image of the equestrian sport. To achieve the widest possible publicity it must be included in the **Schedules** and it is recommended that it also be included in the **Programmes** of all major international events.

CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. *At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.*
2. *Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.*
3. *Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.*
4. *Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.*
5. *The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.*
